THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – StF 519 verse 1 - by Jenny Hewer

Father, I place into your hands the things I cannot do. Father, I place into your hands the times that I've been through. Father, I place into your hands the way that I should go, For I know I always can trust you.

REFLECTION:

This is often used with prayers in public worship, with each prayer interspersed with a verse of the hymn. We are all fallible, unable to do things in our own strength, and need help in dealing with the various aspects of daily living.

In the sentiment "placing things into God's hands", we acknowledge that God is the author and finisher of our faith. In him every aspect of our lives knows blessing, guidance, encouragement, comfort, and forgiveness. Our lives can be transformed by trusting God. He is unfailing, unchanging, always there for us, loving and forgiving. God can change situations for the better, bring light into dark places, hope in place of despair, reconciliation instead of strife, resentment or bitterness.

We need God, as the verse says for "the things we cannot do". We often have a desire or need to do something, don't feel up to the task, offer up a desperate prayer, and we find the strength to accomplish that particular thing.

We also need him to offer us peace of mind, closure, finality when we place into his hands "the things we've been through". We all have times of regret for things said or done, and God enables us to often rectify our mistakes; or to endure the event we have suffered,.

The future often is a source of anxiety (I know it always used to be for me, in my pre-Christian life) but if we offer each and every day back to God, place all things into his hands, cast off the baggage, if you like, then he will always direct the "way we should go".

Some may find problems with the idea of Father God, and that is fine, because God also has the gentle, loving, nurturing nature of a mother. However we address God it doesn't change his/her essential nature. God will always be love, and deserve our trust. Every blessing, *John*.
