Thought for the Week – Hymn No. StF 378 v. 1 – part

"Father of everlasting grace......you have, in honour of your Son, The gift unspeakable sent down, the Spirit of life, and power and love". <u>REFLECTION:</u>

This hymn, one of Charles Wesley's, and the selection in the Methodist Prayer handbook for Friday, celebrates Pentecost and the giving of the holy spirit to the early believers, which marked the birthday of the Christian Church.

This Sunday is Pentecost Day, so named after the Jewish feast of Pentecost, originally celebrated 50 days after the feast of the Passover, which in turn remembered the delivery of the people of Israel from Egypt. It was a time celebrating the completion of the barley harvest and was to be a holiday, when sacrifices of thanksgiving were made.

The bible tells us it was the time at which the Holy Spirit was given (descended on) the disciples accompanied by the signs of fire and wind.

The Holy Spirit in theology has become an indivisible part of the Holy Trinity – our three person God – who is Father, Son & Holy Spirit. Christians believe it is the Holy Spirit whom Jesus promised, who has come into the world and in the words of Charles Wesley is the source of the believers' "life, and power and love."

Evangelical Christians believe that it is in and through the Spirit that we "live and move and have our being" and the Spirit gives us gifts, such as preaching, teaching, healing, administration, serving, and the church today is made up of people who have and exercise those gifts for the good of all both within the fellowship and the community at large..

Further, the indwelling of the Spirit helps transform us from our old nature into the kind of people God would have us be. Fruits of the Spirit are evidence of that transformation and listed by Paul in Galatians 5 as love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

It is said that it is the Holy spirit which first prompts us, speaks to our souls if you like, and convicts us of the need for Christ in our life, leading to repentance, forgiveness and the new birth, which Jesus speaks of in John chap. 3.

Yet, we have to realise that our becoming believers is not of our doing but down to God's "everlasting grace". We just have to say "Yes" to God, when he calls us, however that call may come.

So as we have the opportunity this Pentecost Sunday (although I personally prefer the term Whit or White Sunday), let us give thanks for the Holy Spirit who is the "author and finisher of our faith" Every blessing, *John.*
