THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – THANKS FOR FRIENDS:

One of the great blessings is to have a good and close friend, and if one is fortunate enough to have several, then that is something to be really grateful for.

At different stages in life we have friends – at school, at university, in the armed services, at work, in early retirement, and later in life. Sometimes we are especially privileged to have a life-long friend, someone whom we have known for as long as we can remember, and that relationship is special because it has never lapsed, through time and distance, and one makes special effort to maintain it. Such a friend Jean and I have, with whom Jean went to school and they met each other when Jean changed schools- over 70 years ago. We (she, her husband and both of us) have shared happy times and not so happy, whose children have grown up simultaneously with ours and we have attended their weddings. We have had multiple holidays together both at home and abroad. We have another couple, with whom we have been friends for fifty-plus years, and our children shared holidays.

Such long-term relationships are good because you have much in common, and when you eventually meet up after a time, because geographical or health problems have prevented getting together, then it is that you carry on conversation, almost where you last left off.

It is a proven fact that for good health one needs company of others, and to just talk, about anything and everything – what we call "putting the world to rights!" That is why clubs and associations, public houses and churches are good, because they enable caring and sharing and no one should be alone or lonely for too long. Befriending whether in person or by telephone is an important way of combating loneliness.

These days people don't tend to mix with their neighbours and indeed it is often the case that we don't know those who live around us at all.

Friendships begin often with a "Hello, how are you?" That is all it takes to make a conversation, then mutual introductions follow, and the next time you see each other, it may go further, and before long acquaintances become good neighbours, who in turn become friends over a shared coffee or a meal.

It is difficult to make friends as one gets older, because of fewer opportunities, perhaps not working, or not getting out as much. Another aspect is that it is the nature of aging that we also lose long term friends.

So let us appreciate and value every friendship, and avoid taking others for granted, and If appropriate tell them how much they mean to us.

After all, God has called us into a relationship with the Creator, Saviour, Friend, Jesus, Who offers us a special relationship with Him, and our relationships with others are, or should be, a reflection of the love within which we are held. As the hymnwriter says in StF 619 let's give "Thanks for friends who keep on loving".
