# THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK Hymn StF No. 727 – God in his love for us lent us this planet

God in his love for us lent us this planet, gave it a purpose in time and in space; small as a spark from the fire of creation, cradle of life and the home of our race.

Thanks be to God for its bounty and beauty, life that sustains us in body and mind:

plenty for all, if we learn how to share it, riches undreamed of, to fathom and find.

Long have our human wars ruined its harvest; long has earth bowed to the terror of force;

long have we wasted what others have needed, poisoned the fountain of life at its source.

Earth is the Lord's: it is ours to enjoy it, ours, as God's stewards, to farm and defend.

## From its pollution, misuse, and destruction, good Lord, deliver us, world without end.

**REFLECTION:** Fred Pratt Green was a Methodist minister whose long life, in the latter part, produced many hymns, many of them concerned with social issues such as the theme of this one – care for what God has created. In our hymnbook we find the following among others - 346 Christ is the world's light; 124 For the fruits of all creation; 25 God is here as we, his people; 705 It is God who holds the nations in the hollow of his hand; 595 Lord we have come at your own invitation; 415 The church of Christ in every age; 233 When Jesus came to Jordan; 644 When our confidence is shaken.

The theme of global warming and its effects is now a mainstream concern for us, and as Christians we are all bound to consider what we do, what we use, such as plastics, which may have a detrimental effect on the environment. We are told it is about reducing our carbon footprint. We believe all that we see around us, all that we enjoy, is down to God's bounty in creating it and re-creating it season by season in unfailing love. This aspect of God' bounty is reflected in harvest worship. Pratt Green begins by saying God has lent us the planet, we call "home of our race". It is the cradle of life, which we get to know in all its variety through such TV programmes as Planet Earth III, currently screening. Exploration is still going on to discover earth's "hidden treasures" (the theme of the Methodist Prayer Handbook this year), and the "riches undreamed of are there to fathom and find". Our responsibility is to avoid the things Pratt Green mentions in the third stanza – wars ruining harvests (as in Ukraine), the use of force", careless waste of our surplus, while others have real need, and the poisoning of oceans, rivers and soil,. The final couplet reminds us that although the earth is ours to enjoy, as stewards we owe it to God (for "the earth is the Lord's") to "farm and defend it from pollution, misuse, and destruction", whether it is deforestation or over-fishing or mining of the mineral resources.

The Methodist connexion has urged us to keep this subject in the forefront of our minds and to refer to it in our worship, including our prayers.

Thanks are due to Rev Pratt Green, who was well ahead of his time with his thoughts on this and similar matters, as reflected in his many hymns. Every blessing, *John*.
