THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK:

'And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year "Give me a light that I might tread safely into the unknown. And he replied "Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God. That shall be better than light and safer than a known way". So I went forth and finding the Hand of God, trod gladly into the night. So heart be still; what need our little life, our human life, to know, if God has comprehension ? God knows; His will is best.' <u>REFLECTION:</u>

This poem, known as The Gate of the Year or God Knows, was written by Minnie Louise Haskins in 1908 and published privately in 1912 as part of a collection called The Desert. It came to public attention when King George VI used it as part of his 1939 Christmas broadcast, just after the outbreak of World War 2. The late Queen Mother found it inspirational and at her request it was included in her funeral service.

To me, it confirms that we are not alone in the journey that is life. As we begin another year, if we place our trust in God, in every area of our life, then he does indeed take our hand into his, and he guides, protects, provides, and through regular prayer, shows us his will, and enables us to follow it.

Another aspect of the journey of life is that we do not have to travel it alone, in human terms. God in his goodness ensures we have others who are our travelling companions. When we are happy such people share that joy with us; when we are sad or in distress these same people – be they friends, neighbours, family members or colleagues – are there for us, with a comforting hand and a sympathetic ear.

So, as we tread into 2024, with our hands in the Hand of God, we have confidence, faith and trust. We have our past experience of blessings to encourage us. God has already blessed us in so many ways. He is steadfast, unchangeable, 'the same yesterday, today and forever'. A happy, peaceful and healthy New Year to all. *John.*
