THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – ISAIAH 55 (part):

"Incline your ear, and come to me, listen, so that you may live......Seek the Lord while he may be found, call upon him while he is near.....for he will abundantly pardon......For you shall go out in joy, and be led back in peace; the mountains and the hills before you shall burst into song, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands."

<u>REFLECTION</u> – This portion from Isaiah is taken from Friday's Lectionary reading in the Methodist Prayer Handbook.

We tend to try to face life in our own strength and we often find ourselves overwhelmed by circumstances or events, or happenings about which we have no control. It is at such times that we need to turn to God, in fact, if we seek to live the life of faith, there is no part of it, I feel, in which we do not involve our caring God.

Through prayer, we are merely talking to God. But as in normal conversation we need to hear what the other person is saying. The scripture here urges us to incline our ears, to not continually bombard God with our wants and needs, but to listen – contemplatively and reflectively to what he says to us. God speaks to us through his Spirit which communes with our inner self. He also speaks to us through the Word, scripture; through our past experiences; through the church's traditions in worship and in Christian fellowship; and through other people.

Some of that which keeps us from close communion with God is a sense of guilt. The text goes on to say "Seek the Lord, call upon him, he will abundantly pardon". That is why confession is an integral part of our regular worship – it enables us to 'put things right' with God.

God's goodness is so great that his Creation even praises him, too! We sing the hymn 487 from time to time, which is a paraphrase of the words about going out in joy and we have the words "There'll be shouts of joy and the trees of the field shall clap, shall clap their hands – and you'll go out with joy".

May that be our experience when we know for a certainty that we are 'right with God'; because we are in a close, daily relationship with him, prepared to listen, to seek his pardon; and knowing it is not withheld, we can be filled with a sense of joy, as we journey on in faith and renewed love for him who first loves us, in Christ, who gave his all for us, and continues to give, because we are his much loved children.
