<u>THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - PSALM 86 v 5</u> "You are forgiving and good, O Lord, abounding in love to all who call on you."

REFLECTION: This week has seen the beginning of what western churches call the period of Lent, which runs from Shrove Tuesday to Easter Day, a period of forty days plus seven Sundays. This Sunday, the Liturgy deals with Jesus' temptation, when, we are told in the gospels, he faced forty days' being tempted, tried and tested in the desert. Further Sundays deal with other aspects of what we call

Christ's Passion culminating with our Lord's rising on the third day, celebrated on Easter Sunday.

For believers Lent can be a time of repentance, self-denial and re-dedication to God, a time of reflection, contemplation and spiritual renewal.

Part of spiritual growth is knowing ourselves and our weaknesses and failings; asking God to take from our makeup those things that hinder our closer walk with him.

The verse from Psalm 85, a psalm by king David, reminds us that as we repent of our failings and determine to be better followers of Jesus, God does forgive us, because his love is immeasurable, and he loves all of us, "all who call on his name".

Whatever action, if any, we take to observe Lent, it is because we want better to love and serve God, who loves and cares for each one of us. Every blessing, *John*.
