THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK 1 Peter 4 verse 8

" Above all, Love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins."

REFLECTION – During Lent we are journeying once again with Jesus towards Jerusalem and our Lord's Passion, wherein he showed his love for us in his suffering, his redeeming death: and ultimate victory over the grave, celebrated by the church on Easter Day.

Lent is a time when believers can draw closer to God and that can be through self-denial, meditation, prayer, fasting, or seeking God's will for our lives.

Part of our spiritual growth is surely following the tenets of Jesus, who urged his followers to "love one another as I have loved you" (John 13, 34/35). This was at the supper Jesus had with his disciples, before he was betrayed, and he had washed their feet, and shared bread and wine with them.

"Love covers a multitude of sins", we read above. To me, that speaks of overlooking or disregarding the things others may say or do to us. It speaks of forgiveness of others, as

God forgives us on a daily basis, and which we plea for in the Lord's prayer.

The quotation above begins with "Above all" in Peter's words, the whole chapter being worth reading in the section entitled Christian living. "Above all" indicates and emphasises the importance of Christian love.

If only people could "love each other deeply", what a difference we would see in our troubled world.

As we continue through Lent, let us dig deep in our hearts to mine the reserves of compassion (another word for love) and starting with our own personal relationships, then encourage the expression of love In our church fellowship, in the community, in our nation, throughout the world.

This may sound naive, but love expressed in word and deed, backed up by prayer, can make a difference and can be our offering to God during this period of Lent. More effective than giving up chocolate, I suggest!
