THOUGHTS FOR EASTER DAY:

Inspired by "Celtic Prayers" by David Adam – adapted

Celtic prayers were used in Saxon times, and introduced by early saints such as St. Cuthbert and St. Aidan, who brought the gospel to ancient Britain. Christ risen in glory, scatter the darkness from our path Lift the heaviness from our hearts, dispel the troubles from our minds. Christ risen in glory, take the weariness from your world, And we will serve you with joy in our hearts, with faith, hope and love.

In the light of our Lord's having risen we have the hope of new life, too, both in the here and now, a life of purpose, fulfilment and service – and at the end of our earthly journey life everlasting. So we can say the following prayer with confidence in the Celtic tradition –

I arise to life today, I arise to light and love, through the love of God above I arise to life today in the power of the Creator adored. I arise to life today through Christ, our risen Lord I arise to life today with energy for each hour, in the Holy Spirit's power.

We celebrate our holy day (Sunday) as the "last day of the week", our seventh day when we rest in God, as per the commandment. Sunday is also special to us because it is the "third day" mentioned in the gospel account of the Resurrection, Jesus having been crucified on the eve(Friday) of the Jewish Sabbath, which is Saturday, their last day of the week. Hence, because of the Resurrection having been discovered on Sunday, the Christian tradition also celebrates every Sunday as a remembrance that we worship a "risen Lord". And we sing "This is the day, this is the day that the Lord has made,...this is the day he rose again, he rose again".

To conclude here is a further Celtic prayer –

Risen Christ, come.

Raise the fallen, strengthen the weak, support the weary. Give peace to the troubled, comfort to the anxious. Uplift all who are down, give wholeness and healing. Risen Christ, be with us now and forever.
