<u>THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK</u> - Psalm 118 verse 24 NIV – "This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it." <u>REFLECTION –</u>

Psalm 118 which was Monday's lectionary psalm, begins and ends with the exhortation "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures for ever." We are given each day as a gift from God, to live as best a life as we can, I believe.
