#### THOOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - 1 Peter 3 verses 10 and 11 – part

"Each one should use whatever gifts they have received to serve others.....and do it with the strength God provides, ... to bring praise to God...." REFLECTION –

It falls to each of us as disciples of Jesus Christ to serve the Servant King, who taught us to serve one another in the example of washing his disciples' feet. The question often is "In what way can I serve God?", not because I must but because I <u>can</u>! It is up to each one to know what we are good at what "gifts" or talents we have, and to offer that skill to serve others. Sometimes we feel called to do something in the way of voluntary service, because we want to 'give something back', recognising that we have received so much in our own lives.

It is no shame to start volunteering and to find that it is not for us, after a few sessions. Some hold back for that very reason. It is through failing in something that we learn, so that we can focus on something else. After all, God closes some doors and then opens others.

It is also good to know that when we feel low, tired, disheartened, discouraged, that we can look to God for the strength mentally, spiritually and physically to carry on. Whatever we do for others, it is not ourselves, but God working through us. After all, we are meant to be Jesus' lips, hands and feet as we seek to spread the Gospel of love in a practical way.

We don't undertake roles in the church or in the community for our own self-esteem, but to bring "praises to God". May that be our experience. Every blessing, *John*.
