THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - ROMANS 12 verse 16 part, and verse 18

"Live in harmony with one another. If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone."

<u>REFLECTION –</u>

Continuing with Paul's helpful guidance to his readers in Rome on the subject of Christian living, under the heading "love" in the NIV version, we touch on the root of problems in society, namely that of mutual respect, I suggest.

How is this desirable "harmony" achieved? It is about getting to know and appreciate and respect the other person or persons; taking time to realise what are their priorities, what motivates them, before taking a dislike, or giving way to a snap judgment in a negative way. That was Jesus' way. He talked to people first, showed compassion, empathy and offered help where needed. Speaking of snappy judgments, the other day someone who was big, intimidating, and dressed in the gear one associates, rightly or wrongly, with criminal fraternity, showed me great kindness and courtesy. Looks can deceive!

Harmony comes from the realisation that we are a very diverse society, and everyone can and should be included. After all, everyone needs someone. Simply it should be live and let live, and do to others as you would have them do to you. Such an attitude avoids quarrels, disputes, and worse – disharmony!

That leads to the idea of peaceful co-existence, whether with your near neighbours, between different cultures, or internationally. If we all took peace and its

achievement seriously wouldn't the world be a better place! After all Jesus said "blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God" .As we enter a month without printed notices, due to holidays all round in August, I wish anyone going away and creating more memories, a wonderful, refreshing time.
