THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK –Jeremiah chap.29 verses 11 and 12

"For surely, I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Then, when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you."

<u>COMMENT</u> – This is part of a letter Jeremiah wrote to the newly exiled people of Judah when taken to Babylon, where they would stay for seventy years.

The passage contains promises from God, which can be applied to individuals and to our church congregation today. Because God's faithfulness is unchanging.

We tend to worry about the future; about what tomorrow will hold for us. We cannot know the answer to that and where sadness and suffering are concerned, we would not want to know in advance, thus building even more anxiety. God does have plans for each of us and we have to live one day at a time, believing his promise of our wellbeing and of a life with hope.

As a church fellowship we also need to seek out God's plans for us, and to receive a vision of what role our community church has going forward. We have but to sow the seeds of faith and God will continue to water them with his grace, mercy and love. Then let us not give up "calling upon" God, because he always hears us, and answers according to his divine plans. Every blessing, *John*.
