THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – Philippians ch. 2 verse 13 (NIV)

"It is God who is at work in you, enabling you to will and to work for his good pleasure."

COMMENT:

When we are struggling to deal with life's challenges, and daily problems, it is salutary, perhaps, to recall that we have the Spirit of God with us and within us. We do not face life alone. God's presence is with us, everywhere – see psalm 139 !

We are made in God's image. It is sin, we are told that mars that image and offends God. Through faith in Jesus, however, we are reconciled to, and made right with, God. He then proceeds to "remake" us, to transform us individually, into the kind of person he would have us be. ("If anyone is in Christ he is a new person"). This is a work in progress.

Our response to God's love is to seek "to will and to work for his good pleasure" and to serve him where we are, in whatever way he will directs us.

Whatever good we do, it is not to our glory, but for God's, as it is God who works within us.

So when we find ourselves struggling let us call upon the grace and strength of God, freely available to us, enabling us to live life abundantly and pleasing to our Creator/Saviour, who continues daily to re-create us in his image. Every blessing, *John*.
