THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – Ephesians 5 verses 19b & 20

"Sing and make melody to the Lord in your hearts, giving thanks to God the Father at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." <u>COMMENT</u> –

We come to worship for perhaps one hour every week. It is an opportunity to gather together, in fellowship, to care and share, to build each other up in faith, above all to give praise, adoration and thanks to our redeeming Lord.

However, we need not confine our times of praise and thanksgiving to our attendance at a church service.

We can sing and "make melody" to the Lord as we walk, as we drive, as we sit in quiet contemplation during what is called our "quiet time", when we seek to draw near to God, who is always near to us.

"At all times" we can give thanks to God, for thanksgiving is just one partbut a very important part of our prayer life.

If we make a habit of thanking those with whom we share our lives, and don't take them for granted, how much more important that we realise the blessings we receive daily from God and do not take them for granted.

After all, it is the grace and free gift of God in that "while we were still sinners Christ died for us" – Romans 8.v.5 - , to reconcile (make us right) with God, and to give us life abundantly as we put our trust in him. No wonder our hearts sing when we think of such undeserved love ! Every blessing, *John*.
