THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – Psalm 51 verses 10a, 11 & 17, (NIV)

"Create in me a clean heart, O God. Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me. The sacrifice acceptable to God is a broken spirit, a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise." <u>COMMENT:</u>

This passage is from psalm 51, wherein David repents, following his adultery with Bathsheba and his subsequent sending her husband Uriah to his death at the battle front.

That episode represents the low point in his faith journey with God, who had called him from tending the sheep for his father Jesse, helped him to defeat Go-

liath and the Philistines, to overcome the opposition of Saul, and eventually become king of all Israel and Judah. It was perhaps that he felt all-powerful, and that he could do just as he liked.

Anyway, Nathan the prophet speaks to him in reproof as directed by God. He marries the widow Bathsheba, they expect a child, which dies, and he sees this as a punishment, and the psalm is an outpouring of his sorrow, repentance and renewed faith in God.

You can find the whole story in 2 Samuel chapters 11 and 12.

We are all prone to wander from God's care and influence from time to time, to go against his will, and following our own desires, to act in a way with word or deed which offends God. That is our unreformed nature. It is why Jesus had to become one of us, God incarnate, to live a faultless life, setting us an example to follow, to die for our redemption and forgiveness: and why he rose on the third day to give us the promise of eternal life through faith in his name.

In worship, an important part of the service is confession and assurance of God's forgiveness. It is wonderful to know that we can be forgiven for our transgressions.

The words above come from David's heart, and it is from within that temptation and its result, sin, comes. So it makes sense to pray for a "clean heart", for God to remain with us and within us through his Spirit. It is a heartfelt prayer that can restore us to God's blessing with the words "Do not cast me away, do not take your spirit from me"!

When we truly repent and say sorry, we know, because we have the promise of Christ that our sins "will be removed as far as the east is from the west, and "though they are as scarlet they shall be as white as snow" in God's eyes. When we are truly sorry we are made right with God.

Having "a broken spirit, a broken and contrite heart", means, I think, that we have literally cast ourselves on God's mercy and the heart is open to his cleansing, renewal, and forgiveness. After all, the heart, poetically, is thought to be the seat of all of our emotions, and from it can come good or bad. We have a freedom of choice in all aspects of life. Let us always try to choose God's way over our way. Every blessing, *John*.
