#### **THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK- WHY LENT ?**

**COMMENT:** This week sees the beginning of Lent. It starts with Ash Wednesday which follows Shrove Tuesday. Shrove Tuesday takes its name from “shriven” which means a time of repentance marked by a final “feast” before the fasting of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. The relatively modern feast of pancakes is to enable people to use up their supplies of eggs, sugar and butter before beginning the fast. It reflects the old testament tradition of giving up yeast and eating unleavened bread.

Ash Wednesday is celebrated in some churches by the “Ashing ceremony”, when the palm leaves of the previous palm Sunday may be burned to make ash which is then applied to the worshipper’s forehead in the sign of the cross to indicate repentance and rededication. Ash Wednesday is the first day of forty days, during which people may choose to fast.

Observing the forty days of Lent, Christians follow Christ’s sacrifice of withdrawal into the desert for 40 days. Lent is marked by fasting from food and festivities.

Christian churches that do observe Lent (not all do), use it as a time for prayer and penance. Few people fast for 40 days, although some do on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

It is more common to surrender a particular, favourite treat. Whatever the sacrifice it is a time of reflection and self discipline.

Ash Wednesday begins what can be a real time of blessing, as we accompany our Lord once again on a spiritual journey. This culminates in the events of our Lord’s Passion, including the triumph of his entry into Jerusalem, the time of agony in the Garden, his betrayal, arrest, mock trial, rejection, humiliation and Crucifixion; followed by his rising again on the third day, and our joyful celebration on Easter Day, when we sing “Christ the Lord is risen today” (StF no.208).

Wishing you all a blessed Lent, however you may be led to mark the season. *John.*
