<u> THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – Hymn 248 – part</u>

I heard the voice of Jesus say: "Come unto me and rest"; I came to Jesus as I was, weary and worn and sad; .I found in him a resting-place and he has made me glad.

I heard the voice of Jesus say "Behold, I freely give the living water; thirsty one, stoop down and drink and live....I drank of that life-giving stream...my soul revived, and now I live in him.

I heard the voice of Jesus say "I am this dark world's light"....I looked to Jesus and found in him my star, my sun; in that light I'll walk until travelling days are done.

COMMENT-

The author Horatius Bonar, known as Horace, was a Scottish minister, whose family over several generations served as ministers for a total of 364 years! He wrote a total of 140 hymn-songs, some of which are in our hymnbook.

This hymn speaks of three benefits of following Jesus – spiritual and emotional rest: the life giving power of the Holy Spirit; and the light of guidance and example shown us by Jesus' life, sacrificial death and resurrection.

We all experience life with all of its challenges, difficulties and traumas, which may have induced feelings of being "weary, worn and sad". Because we follow Jesus who himself experienced all of life's difficulties that we could face - and more – he understands and promises us "rest", i.e. relief, at least momentarily, from our pain. Indeed trusting in him says the author can give us comfort, reassurance and even "make us glad".

Jesus taught that we are flesh and spirit and that the two often are in conflict. To be spiritually nurtured is to be fed with those feelings which emanate from the "water" of the Holy Spirit, which are just, pure, right, gracious and holy, pleasing to God, and as the author says then we are "living in" God.

There is much that is dark, sad, distressing in life. We can find light in our lives by keeping Jesus and his example uppermost in life, as the hymn says "Look unto me ,your morn shall rise and all your day (will) be bright.

As we need the sun to give us warmth and light by day, and the stars to guide us at night, so by "looking to "our Saviour Jesus, we'll be sure to travel through life in that light which only faith in him gives.
